eLearning day Wednesday 21st August

Our next eLearning day is on Wednesday 21st This will be a Professional Practice August. (PP) day for all teachers at our school, which is a departmental initiative and requirement. Teachers will focus on planning and developing units of work, reviewing common assessment tasks, moderation and assessing student work. The eLearning day will minimise the disruption to student learning across our school, as teaching staff will have the same designated day assigned as their PP day. On Wednesday 21st August, students are able to study from home on tasks that their teachers will set up on Compass. For students who wish to come to school, we need to know beforehand so we can employ casual relief teachers (CRTs) for the day. This will minimise disruption to student learning, and avoids having many CRTs coming in every day. Regular teachers will not be available for students during the day.

We are very happy to accept donations of uniforms as money raised will be put back into our school.


From the Assistant Principal

Demonstrating our DARE values - Chronicle entries

Regularly highlighting our school values of Diversity, Aspiration, Respect and Excellence has been an important factor in establishing the safe, inclusive and positive learning environment we are so proud of at AHS. We have long celebrated demonstration of these values through presentation of our DARE Awards at end of semester assemblies, and the language of our values is very much a part of the culture of our school on a day to day basis.

However, recent feedback from students has suggested that our students would like to further highlight the DARE values through acknowledgement of those moments when students demonstrate our school values in a myriad of different ways, big and often only small. We love receiving this sort of feedback from our students and are always happy to use student feedback to improve.

As a result, we have developed a new DARE Values Chronicle entry on Compass, where teachers can record specific examples where a student has demonstrated one of our school values. These entries are visible to students and parents, and an automated email home will flag when your child has been acknowledged in this way. Students will also receive 10 House points to say thanks! Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from Monday 22nd July to August 18th. The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September.

IT'S TIME TO REGISTER WITH VTAC

VTAC applications opened on 5th August and timely applications close on 30 September. There is a fee of \$39 for timely applications, which goes up to \$113 if you are late! Go to http://www.vtac.edu.au/ to register. You will need to register with VTAC to apply for university courses in Victoria. To register for courses in other States, you will need to register with that State's admissions centre. Once you have created a VTAC account, you will be able to apply for up to eight course preferences. If you have any queries about this process, please come to the Careers Office.

TAX FILE NUMBERS

You will need a tax file number. This is essential if you are planning to work, and also if you are planning to apply for a loan to cover your study costs. To apply for a tax file number, go to Apply-for-a-TFN, complete the application, and print the summary. You will need to book an interview at a local post office - the link to do this is provided on the Apply-page. Take the summary, together with proof of identity documents, to your interview at the Post Office.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships come in a range of categories, some are to do with academic achievement, others relate to equity and hardship, some relate to field of study, some relate to specific institutions, and some relate to various personal attributes. All Year 12 students should have received an email from Careers with an attachment outlining some of the scholarships that are available. There are many scholarships out there—it's up to you to do some research for scholarships in your field of study.

SEAS: Year 12 students who have Australian or New Zealand citizenship or hold a permanent Australian residency visa should apply for Category 1 of the SEAS scholarships. Students applying under other categories can see Ms Martis or Leah for assistance.





