### *Second most improved school in NAPLAN scores across the State*

On Saturday you may have read the article featured in the Herald Sun which highlighted our school's achievement in Year 9 NAPLAN scores. Our Year 9 NAPLAN performance data over the past five years has been outstanding.

I explained to the journalist that this is due to our focus on having consistent and effective practices in every classroom. Our instructional model is now well embedded in classrooms as is our focus on using evidence to make accurate judgments on student performance. The quality of feedback our teachers provide through assessments or during a lesson, has also played a major part in our improvement journey. All new teachers are taken through a thorough induction process before they start where all our processes and protocols are explained. I am very proud of the work we are doing at Auburn High and thank all the staff for their professionalism and embracing our aspirational vision and goals.

### *Incoming Year 7 and VCE information sessions*

We recently hosted two very successful, and very well attended information sessions for our parent community. Our incoming 2020 Year 7 session was titled "Ready, Set, Go" and provided parents with information regarding the upcoming orientation day, transition, key processes and dates. We have just over 150 Year 7s starting with us next year. We had a student panel who answered questions from the floor and they did a brilliant job. Thank you to staff and students who presented and to our School Council President Sue Haralambopoulos and Friends of Auburn High Drew Browning who explained how parents can become more involved in school activities. The next evening we hosted a VCE information session and provided parents with information and explained key terms and processes for the VCE. Our new senior school Years 10-12 Assistant Principal Ross Pritchard was introduced to parents. 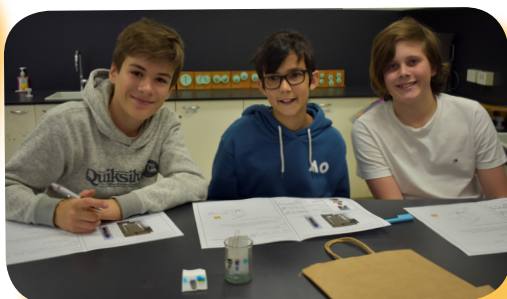


# From the Assistant Principal

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# FRENCH

## *DELFL Results*

We are very pleased to report on the DELF Junior B2 results from the 9F cohort. The DELF is an official certification delivered by France Education International (ex CIEP) that follows the European framework for languages.

Our students sat it in late October at the Alliance Française and all passed the B2 level which recognises them as independent users of French. The B2 level presents real challenges to pass as it draws from real life texts and records to complete the tasks, somehow making it harder than VCE French. It requires a capacity to analyse genuine documents and respond to a theme, building a strong argument and all in the target language.

B2 is the level required to enrol in French tertiary education and we are extremely proud that they can achieve this milestone at such a young age. What makes it also very useful is that the DELF certification models the four components assessed at VCE: oral and written comprehension and oral and written production making it perfect to transition into studying French for VCE. Being developed as a continuum, the DELF is helpful in identifying each students' strengths and areas for growth.

On Orientation Day the future French Binational Year 7s challenged themselves creating a few French tongue twisters. Here are some examples to improve your French pronunciation!

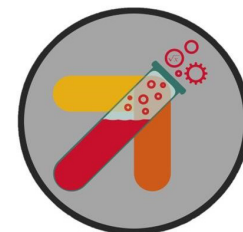

### Healthcare In The Future

Healthcare is the largest growing industry in Australia. By 2023, it is predicted that 28% of all new jobs will come from Healthcare and Social Assistance alone<sup>1</sup>. And with technology and rapid innovation of the 21st century, it is interesting to look at what may happen to healthcare in the future.

Technological advancements are already changing the face of medical care. For instance, robotic surgery is a minimally invasive way of performing surgery using robotic arms. This way, surgery can be done more precisely, which not only benefits the surgeon by helping them deliver the best healthcare, but also the patient themselves, by minimising scarring and resulting in quicker recovery.<sup>2</sup>

Furthermore, Artificial Intelligence (AI) will improve healthcare delivery in the form of virtual assistants. One way is through communicating with patients and getting to know them and their symptoms to aid doctors in preparing the best diagnosis and treatment that will suit the patient individually. In addition, online assistants may also be able to give advice to patients on the best-suited treatment for their diagnosis. Virtual assistant pharmacists would be able to deliver medicine faster than a person, and there would be a secure system in place for recording and storing patient prescriptions. For example, if a patient loses a physical prescription and needs a medicine ASAP, they would be able to easily access an online version through the pharmacy's AI program, rather than risking their diagnosis to wait and get another prescription from their doctor.

Gene modification is another on-the-rise process. Through modifying the DNA of a living organism, like a pet or a human, it is possible to change certain physical traits and remove

illnesses or diseases that someone may be born with and that may run in the family<sup>3</sup>. To illustrate, a person with a disabling syndrome that may be caused as a result of a damaged gene may choose to get that gene repaired, to save them from a life-long disability and the resulting suffering and high medical costs<sup>4</sup>. This use of 'gene editing' can have positive results, however, there are other ways gene modification can be used, and those may not be as positive. 'Designer babies' is an example, where altering the DNA of a baby may give them certain qualities or remove the risk of disease. But even though the intention may be good, there will be some who would use it for other, perhaps less moral, purposes. Moreover, selecting the 'best' baby may not seem ethical to some, adding to the controversy<sup>5</sup>.



New inventions and ways of improving healthcare and medical practices are ever-emerging. It is safe to say that technology will make up a big part of future changes, but other methods such as gene-altering, also have a certain predicted future. Anything is possible, and while we may not know it yet, someone may be developing something new right now that will revolutionise the health industry in a few year's time.

Families are offered three levels of access:

- Search only - registering/logging-in on the Sustainable School Shop, searching all the 'for sale' ads and gaining the sellers' contact details is free.
- Single items cost \$1.50 to be advertised
- Subscription - an annual subscription costs \$21.95 and is the most anyone will pay. These are taken by families who have many items to advertise.

We hope you will make the most of this opportunity and gain the benefit from recycling your student's school items whilst helping another family within our school community.

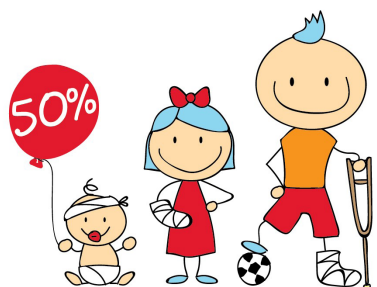
