Circuit breaker lockdown

At the time of writing this newsletter report we are still in the five-day circuit breaker lockdown in Victoria. Over the weekend the leadership team, teachers, Year Level and Learning Area Leaders worked on preparing for assemblies and classes in the online environment. On Monday morning, all staff and students

attended their respective Year Level assemblies where students were reminded of the protocols for remote learning and the support they can access. This meant that all our classes ran as smoothly as they possibly could with such short notice. As a school during remote learning we run every lesson (albeit shortened) and mark the roll. This enables us to continue with our planned teaching and learning program to keep our students engaged and to continue with established routines. If this lockdown is extended, or if there is another mini lockdown, we are confident we can seamlessly move from onsite to remote learning and minimise disruption to student programs. I would like to thank all the staff at Auburn High School for their professionalism, positivity and commitment to student learning and wellbeing.



Wearing masks at school



Meet a scientist - hosted by the Royal Women's Hospital



In honour of International Day of Women and Girls in Science on Thursday 11th February, a group of female students in Years 9 -11 attended '*Meet a Scientist 2021*' hosted by the Royal Women's Hospital. In this event, students heard from female role models working in different areas of STEM, focusing on science, nursing, midwifery and research.

Students heard from Dr. Ellen Menkhorst, a reproductive Biologist and Research fellow whose research focuses on understanding how a healthy placenta forms during early pregnancy and developing new treatments to improve placental function in women at risk of developing preeclampsia; Pamela McCalman, a registered midwife and researcher and proud aboriginal woman who works on the Woman's Journey - Baggarrook Yurrongi & Nuraagh Manma Buliana project to improve the health of Aboriginal mothers and babies through continuity of midwife care; Dr Amanda Kwong, a Paediatric Physiotherapist and postdoctoral researcher whose research interests are concerned with early detection and intervention for infants who are at high risk of cerebral palsy and/ or movement difficulties, and Dr Elizabeth Baker who works in neonatal care and is working on a novel study using cell therapy to help vulnerable preterm babies breathe more easily.

The speakers shared tips about VCE choices and their pathways, about resilience and taking your time to decide about careers, utilising contacts, asking questions and for help.

Students also discussed with each other VCE pathways and work experience opportunities to help them with their decision making about their future careers.


French Binational

- The system is simple and easy to use If you don't have a computer, internet access or an email address, please call the Sustainable School Shop for assistance
- You can pre-arrange the transaction and then trade after the texts are not required.

Families are offered three levels of access:

- Search only registering/logging-in on the Sustainable School Shop, searching all the 'for sale' ads and gaining the sellers' contact details is free.
- Single items cost \$1.50 to be advertised
- Subscription an annual subscription costs \$21.95 and is the most anyone will pay. These are taken by families who have many items to advertise.

We hope you will make the most of this opportunity and gain the benefit from recycling your student's school items whist helping another family within our school community.
