#### A new classroom

To accommodate the rapid increase in student numbers at our school this year, we have converted a number of smaller workspaces off the canteen dining room into a brand new classroom, "G10". This new room is a lovely, big, bright space and is proving quite popular with staff and students! New carpet will be installed in this room in coming weeks, thanks to donations from our community into the Building Fund.

#### Aim for 100% attendance

Research shows that academic outcomes are enhanced by maximising attendance at school. This makes good sense, as students who are in class will benefit from the instruction of their teachers and are better able to build upon their skills and knowledge sequentially, so every day really does count. Of course, there will be times when it is unavoidable for a student to miss a day of school. In such instances, parents/guardians are asked to notify the school of the reason for the absence via the Compass Parent Portal. Parents/guardians are notified via an automated SMS alert if a student is marked absent in the morning without parent approval. These alerts are sent out during period one on the day of the absence, which is intended as a helpful reminder to go in and provide your approval or to contact the office if you believe you have received an alert in error.

Please encourage your child to arrive punctually to school and to classes, including Tutor Group, as coming in even a couple of minutes late can mean they are missing the introduction to the lesson which can really set them back. Rushing in late also means they won't have time to organise themselves properly for the lesson, something which again can really set them back. Please contact your relevant Subschool Manager if you would like to discuss particular concerns around attendance or punctuality. Students who arrive late to school at any time throughout the day are expected to report to the front office for a late pass and may be given a lunch time detention.

To support 100% attendance, please avoid scheduling family holidays during term time, if at all possible.

In the event a family holiday must take place during term time, families are asked to submit a Holiday Notification using the proforma located under School Documentation on the Compass Community tab. Please note that teachers will not provide specific "holiday homework" whilst a student is away, however in some instances it may be possible for students to access key tasks via Compass.

#### Lorri Beer Memorial Prize for Philanthropy

Congratulations to Year 10 student Amy Goode, winner of our second annual Lorri Beer Memorial Prize for Philanthropy. Amy recently initiated the "Ponytail Project" at AHS and Malvern Primary School, raising awareness and funds by cutting off her long ponytail to be made into wigs for young people who have lost their hair due to medical conditions. Her selfless actions demonstrate her commitment to community service and is a wonderful example of our school DARE values in action. 
#### Library Lovers' Day



Parents have the ability to trade second-hand items such as textbooks via the Sustainable School Shop website.

The link is also accessible via Favourites on Compass. Results from other schools have been excellent - families have enjoyed a very comprehensive and convenient method of buying and selling second-hand items.

The new service is very accessible, it preferences our school first and then provides access to buy and sell items with families attending other schools - many schools use this service so this provides a good range. Access to second-hand textbooks, calculators, stationery, musical equipment, etc is available all year.

• The service does not include uniform. We have an on-site second-hand uniform shop here at school.

For the best results:

- Register on the Sustainable School Shop website
- List your items for sale
- List wanted ads for those items you are looking to buy
- The school's booklists are loaded into the system to make listing ads easy
- The system matches the ads of buyers with sellers and notifies the buyer via email
- Buyers contact sellers and arrange where and when to trade
- Most trading will occur with other parents from our school
- Parents are well supported via Sustainable School Shop's telephone (0438 743 444) and email help lines
- The system is simple and easy to use If you don't have a computer, internet access or an email address, please call the Sustainable School Shop for assistance
- You can pre-arrange the transaction and then trade after the texts are not required.

Families are offered three levels of access:

- Search only registering/logging-in on the Sustainable School Shop, searching all the 'for sale' ads and gaining the sellers' contact details is free.
- Single items cost \$1.50 to be advertised
- Subscription an annual subscription costs \$21.95 and is the most anyone will pay. These are taken by families who have many items to advertise.

We hope you will make the most of this opportunity and gain the benefit from recycling your student's school items whist helping another family within our school community.

Of course, donations of second-hand items such as textbooks, uniform items and (school) laptops are always welcome. Just drop these in at the office, with our thanks.
