### Welcome to Term 1

Welcome back to all our families and in particular, I extend a very warm welcome to all our new families that are joining Auburn High School. Our school enrolment numbers continue to increase, with Auburn becoming the school of choice. Despite the challenges our Year 12 students faced last year with COVID19, our school achieved its highest scores for VCE to date.

We were very excited to welcome back our students last week and are grateful that community transmission numbers of COVID have been zero for several weeks. One thing last year taught us was the need to be adaptable and be prepared for changes. Well, we tested our ability to adapt and respond quickly with the flooding of our school on Friday. Thank you again to our staff and students for their amazing response and positive attitude allowing learning to continue as much as possible.

### Professional Practice Days 2020 - eLearning day Friday 12<sup>th</sup> March

The Department of Education introduced Professional Practice (PP) Days, for all teachers in 2018. This entitles all teachers to have one day per term, released from classes, so they can focus on the improved delivery of high-quality teaching and learning.

Our school uses these days as eLearning days where students can work from home on tasks that have been set by their teachers on Compass and also to catch up on work. We have found that this approach has been less disruptive to the student learning program as teaching staff have the same designated day. It also minimises the number of Casual Relief Teachers (CRTs) that students have during this period.

The eLearning dates are published in the newsletter calendar. Our first eLearning day is on **Friday 12<sup>th</sup> March**.

A temporary waterproofing membrane has now been fitted until the new roof surface is completed. Thank you also to those families who reached out to offer their support and words of encouragement – this was greatly appreciated. We are very grateful to have such a supportive school community.

Despite this slight set-back, the project remains on schedule and there are visible changes from one day to the next. Our new classrooms are almost finished, with glazing scheduled for this week. ## *Road safety reminder*

With the start of the new school year, a reminder to please discuss with your children the importance of road safety and paying close attention to your surroundings when making your way to and from school. This means:

Ensuring you are not listening to headphones - you need to be able to hear the traffic/ hazards around you,

Don't step out between parked cars - always use the pedestrian crossing,

Make sure you look left, right and left again before you cross the road or side-street (or driveways, or getting on/ off the tram),

Remember that drivers/ cyclists can get distracted and may not see you - make sure you see them!

Make sure you bring a chain and lock if you are scooting/ cycling to school so you can lock your ride up securely in the bike racks,

Bear in mind that bike/ scooter parking is now temporarily located on the asphalt area at Gate 3 off Tooronga Rd. Please sit down together with your child to discuss how this slight change affects their route into the school grounds, including where to safely cross the road. There is a green bike lane clearly marked once inside the school gate, but it would be a good idea to plot a safe route up to that point, depending on the direction your child is coming from.

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### General personal safety reminder

It's important to have regular discussions with your child about their general personal safety whilst out in the community and travelling to and from school, for example:

Keep your parent(s) updated on any plans that may suddenly change.

- If someone you don't know or don't feel comfortable with offers you a ride, say no.
- If you are approached by an adult for help or for directions, stay alert, as this may be an attempt to draw you in closer. And keep in mind, adults should ask for help or directions from other adults, not children.
- If anyone follows you, bothers you or makes you feel uncomfortable, get away from him or her as quickly as you can, then be sure to tell a parent, teacher or other trusted adult.
- One of the most important tips – trust your gut feeling. If something doesn't feel right, don't do it.

### Extra-curricular program

The Extra-curricular Clubs and Activities program will commence in the next week or so. Students will find the calendar on the Extra-curricular Noticeboard by the Student Entry. All students are encouraged to participate in the program, whether it's something they've never tried before or something they know and love. As well as being a great way to socialise, it's also an opportunity to earn points toward an Extra-curricular Badge in STEM, Arts, Sport, Philanthropy and Communication.

Our Instrumental Music program will also commence in the coming week. Tuition is available in brass, woodwind, drums, keyboard, voice, guitar and bass guitar. ## THANK YOU

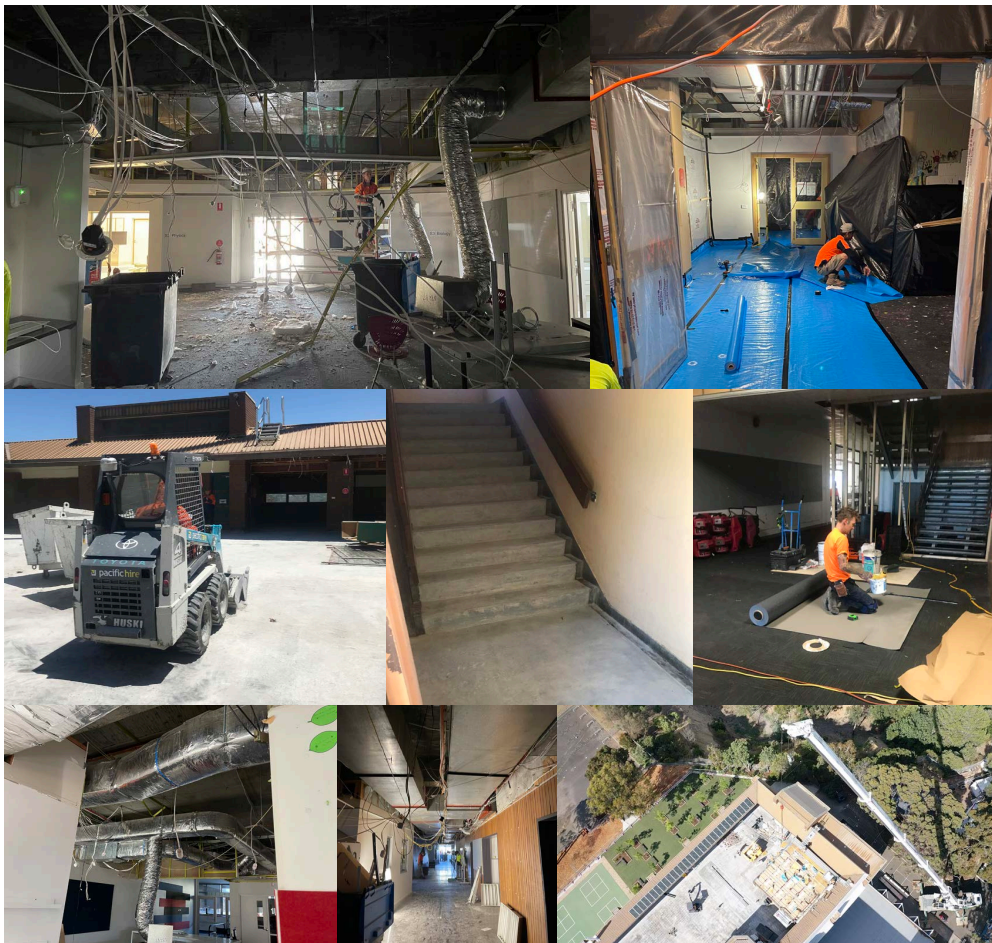
While you were on break, lots happened at the school to make it a safer and better space for students and staff. Dozens of builders, electricians, demolition teams, crane operators, and many others worked some extraordinary hours taking only Christmas Day and New Years Day off.

Coming back to start the year with building work still scheduled to happen isn't easy, but we're doing our best to work with the needs of the school and we really appreciate how patient and understanding everyone has been.

On the rooftop, the crane worked non-stop all summer removing demolition debris from the plant room, music room and the removal of the top layers of the roof slab, preparing it for new waterproofing, drainage and resurfacing. The roof in its current stage of demolition bore the brunt of the extreme rain event last week, but a temporary waterproofing membrane has now been fitted to prevent any further indoor rain events







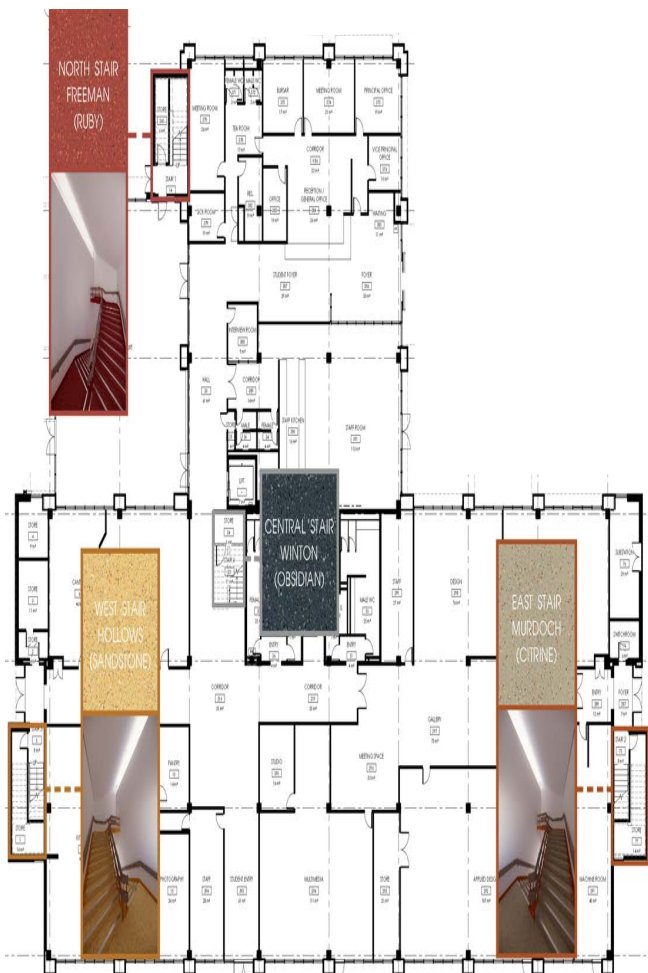

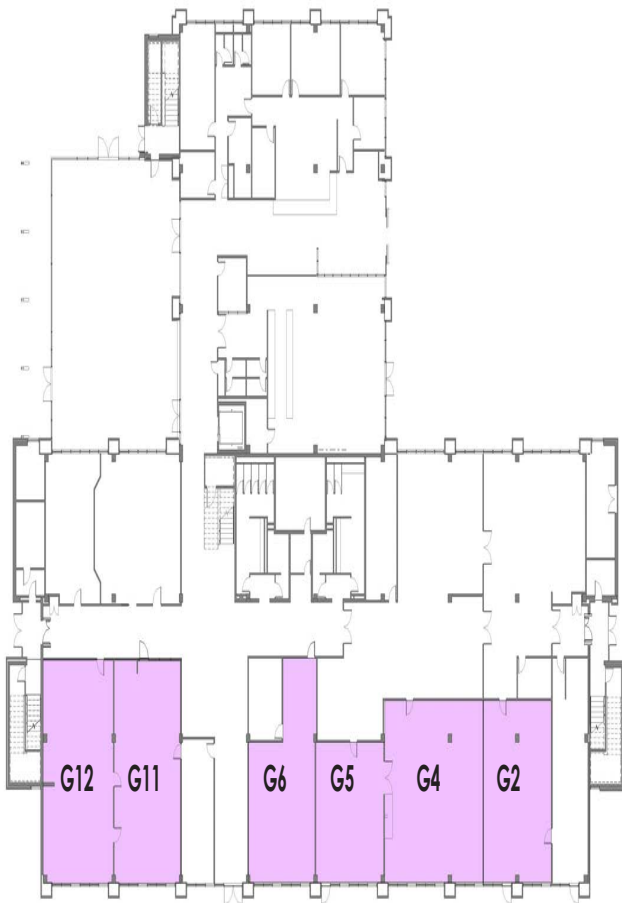

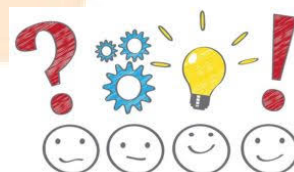

The link is also accessible via Favourites on Compass. Results from other schools have been excellent - families have enjoyed a very comprehensive and convenient method of buying and selling second-hand items.

The new service is very accessible, it preferences our school first and then provides access to buy and sell items with families attending other schools - many schools use this service so this provides a good range. Access to second-hand textbooks, calculators, stationery, musical equipment, etc is available all year.

- The service does not include uniform. We have an on-site second-hand uniform shop here at school.

For the best results:

- List your items for sale
- List wanted ads for those items you are looking to buy
- The school's booklists are loaded into the system to make listing ads easy
- The system matches the ads of buyers with sellers and notifies the buyer via email
- Buyers contact sellers and arrange where and when to trade
- Most trading will occur with other parents from our school
