COVID-19



The last few weeks have been challenging for schools and our community as the COVID-19 pandemic is evolving worldwide. It is natural to feel stressed when scenes of concern are constantly on the news and social media, and supermarket shelves are emptying. I understand that everyone is a little more stressed

at the moment. In schools and in our lives, we need to remain calm and behave responsibly, as we set the example for children on how to cope in these situations.

We are unsure of when schools may be closing as the health experts are the ones who will determine the best timing of this decision. I am reassuring families that at Auburn High School we are being proactive and taking measures to prepare for likely school closures. This week all teachers attended a session on how to set up for video conferencing so we can have online classrooms in Microsoft Teams and we successfully trialled this. Our priority is to maintain continuity in student learning as best as we can. We have also asked our cleaners to work extra hours and disinfect high-touch surfaces at school. such as handrails and tables and restock soap dispensers and paper towelling every evening. As per my newsfeeds, students and staff should not be coming to school if they are feeling unwell.

Thank you to our staff and parent community for your regular feedback and communication during this challenging time. With transparency and regular communication we are helping ourselves and others around us.

Teaching E4L with year 8C

One of my enjoyments at school is visiting classrooms and seeing the learning that is happening so when Louisa Phillipson asked if I would like to teach an Education 4 Life (E4L) class with her I jumped at this offer. We ran a session with Year 8C on how to build friendships and the types of interactions and relationships that build strong friendships. Students worked in groups discussing scenarios and answering questions such as 'How do we connect more positively with one another?' and, 'Being funny is another great way to connect. How can this go wrong though?' It was great to hear the thoughtful responses that students came up with and they modelled what positive interactions look like. Education 4 Life is such an important subject in our school as it explicitly teaches our students personal, social and cognitive skills to develop them as better citizens.



Professional Learning Communities (PLC)

Last week I attended the Inner East secondary schools PLC training sessions. PLC's are an approach to school improvement where groups of teachers work collaboratively at the school level to improve student outcomes. It was great sharing practices with other secondary schools about the approach they are taking in implementing these teams. We will be addressing two key improvement strategies from our new School Strategic Plan and Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) through our PLC work. These are:

- Build staff capacity to implement a school-wide approach to student writing at all year levels and in all learning areas,
- Develop and embed a consistent approach, through Professional Learning Communities, where teachers use assessment to inform and differentiate teaching practice and student learning.

Dear Students,



The link is also accessible via Favourites on Compass. Results from other schools have been excellent - families have enjoyed a very comprehensive and convenient method of buying and selling second-hand items.

The new service is very accessible, it preferences our school first and then provides access to buy and sell items with families attending other schools - many schools use this service so this provides a good range. Access to second-hand textbooks, calculators, stationery, musical equipment, etc is available all year.

• The service does not include uniform. We have an on-site second-hand uniform shop here at school.

For the best results:

- Register on the Sustainable School Shop website
- · List your items for sale
- List wanted ads for those items you are looking to buy
- The school's booklists are loaded into the system to make listing ads easy
- The system matches the ads of buyers with sellers and notifies the buyer via email
- Buyers contact sellers and arrange where and when to trade
- · Most trading will occur with other parents from our school
- Parents are well supported via Sustainable School Shop's telephone (0438 743 444) and email help lines
- The system is simple and easy to use If you don't have a computer, internet access or an email address, please call the Sustainable School Shop for assistance
- You can pre-arrange the transaction and then trade after the texts are not required.

Families are offered three levels of access:

- Search only registering/logging-in on the Sustainable School Shop, searching all the 'for sale' ads and gaining the sellers' contact details is free.
- Single items cost \$1.50 to be advertised
- Subscription an annual subscription costs \$21.95 and is the most anyone will pay. These are taken by families who have many items to advertise.

We hope you will make the most of this opportunity and gain the benefit from recycling your student's school items whist helping another family within our school community.

Of course, donations of second-hand items such as textbooks, uniform items and (school) laptops are always welcome. Just drop these in at the office, with our thanks.

- Listing Wanted and For Sale Ads gets results
- Our unique Ad Matching Service shows you who to transact with, and will save you lots of time
- Be realistic when pricing items
- Telephoning sellers provides a quicker response as many people do not regularly check their emails
- Pre-arrange who to transact with if your items are still being used and write the availability date in your Ad
- Respect other browsers and remember to delist your ad promptly when no longer needed
- Parents/guardians (rather than students) should meet somewhere convenient to transact, don't make special trips and just fit it in to your normal activities
