## Monash University – Principals' visit and World Teachers' Day

Last week we hosted a large delegation of school principals from the Zhejiang Province in China. The members of the delegation are taking part in a three-week Professional Learning Program with Monash Faculty of Education, focusing on school leadership. Our school was included, as we have hosted delegations in the past, and we are recognised as a high performing school in Melbourne. They were interested to see how strategic school leadership and a strong school culture can transform a school. They visited classrooms and we explained the key strategies we have embedded in our practice, which ensures consistency in our classrooms. Danni Gibson and Mihi De Silva explained our common instructional model, and how teachers collaborate on curriculum program design and common assessment tasks. The visitors were very impressed with our teaching staff and our focus on student learning. Their visit was very timely as on the day we were celebrating World Teachers Day. They joined us for a lovely morning tea where we celebrated and thanked our wonderful teaching staff for their work in supporting and challenging our students.

# STEM



## Conoco Phillips Science Experience

Over the term three holidays I was able to take part in the Conoco Phillips Science Experience located

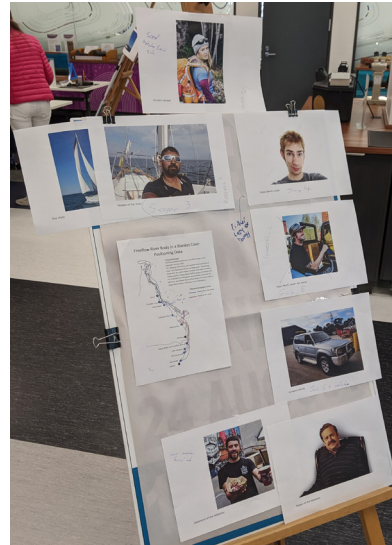


at the Australian National University in Canberra. This program ran for three days and we

were taken around in groups to explore and use the university's facilities. The experience also featured a few employees from Questacon who taught us about physics with engaging activities.

Due to the university being the largest of its kind centred around physics, most activities focused on physics. Through this we learnt about dark matter, plasma, quantum mechanics and radiation. During this time, as a student interested in forensic science, I was very happy to find out we would try our hand at DNA profiling.

On the final day of the program we visited the labs at ANU and performed a common DNA profiling technique called RFLP. This was my absolute highlight of the experience as it really gave us a taste of what it's like to be a forensic scientist. We tested samples against those found at our fake crime scene to find the culprit.



We also had a go at forensic sedimentology at Geoscience Australia. We were given around nine samples of different dirt and minerals taken from several locations and objects. We were tasked with putting together our own crime board to solve the case of the body hidden along the

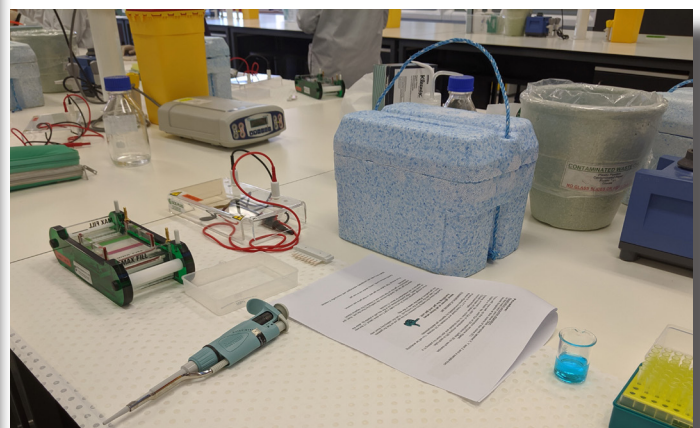
river. To solve this crime, we were given autopsy reports, eye witness testimonies and alibies. Sadly, my group found that it wasn't mysterious camper four who had murdered her husband after he found out about an ongoing affair. Despite our conclusion not coming at all close to truth, it was extremely fun and made me realise that sedimentology is more interesting than it seems.

The whole experience opened my eyes to just how many different pathways there are in science and I returned home having learnt various new theories and processes and having done many things I never thought I would have had the chance to attempt so early on.

The staff and university students who took time out of their day to show us around were incredibly kind and welcoming and the whole program ran smoothly. I would recommend it to anyone who is thinking about doing it next year. Try it out, as I know from experience you won't regret it and you'll come back having a deeper understanding of science and new knowledge to share with your friends.

## International Eastern Seaboard Regatta



At the last Optimist dinghy Nationals (January 2019 in Hobart), Hamish Gilsenan's (Year 7) and Hugo Vandame's (Year 8) rankings allowed them to qualify for the Australian Optimist Senior Development Squad and to enter the Eastern Seaboard Regatta in



Thailand. Between October 14 and 21, Hamish, Hugo and four teammates trained and raced at the Royal Varuna Yacht Club in Pattaya under the supervision of coach Grant Alderson and Team Manager Xavier Vandame. During a day of racing, the team visited the nearby Ford plant currently building the Ford Rangers. This was very instructive.

Sixty-two young sailors from Thailand, Malaysia and Australia entered the competition including Khun Boonnak, best Thai sailor, sixth at the last World Championship in Antigua (for reference, the best Australian finished 16th in Antigua). The young sailors loved sailing in the warm weather but found the sailing conditions particularly challenging: nine races in light breeze (3 to 9 knots) and strong current (1-1.5 knots), especially when sailing against Malaysian and Thai lightweights. They needed lots of patience and resilience to complete each race. Considering these conditions, and with their weight/height, Hugo and Hamish did well finishing respectively 20th and 31st out of 62.

This was Hamish's last regatta in the Optimist dinghy. He is transitioning to a new class called "Laser" and training hard for the Laser Nationals in January at Sandringham Yacht Club. Hugo is back in Antibes (France) where he has been since end of August in a sports school for young athletes in sailing, swimming, basketball and golf. He is in a special class where the school timetable is organised in a way they can train as much as possible during afternoons with dedicated coaches. The program includes racing in France and neighbouring countries.

## *Reading for pleasure - why book clubs matter*

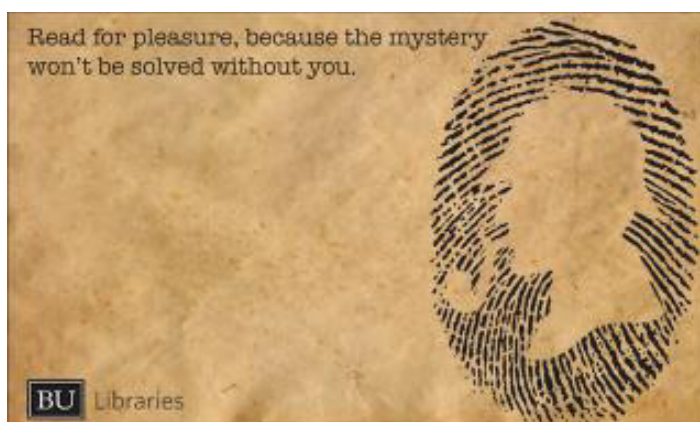
Research has found that student's motivation to read and their reading achievements improve when participating in activities that promote reading. Book clubs provide both an opportunity for students to socialise and engage with adult reader role models. Reading for pleasure advances reading skills, increases vocabulary and gives students skills needed for reading for study and learning.

There is a strong link between motivation and achievement so students who are motivated by pleasure to read are more likely to read to learn. In turn, skills and knowledge are increased through reading which leads to increased achievement.

The Written Word Book Club is held during Friday lunchtime from 1.25pm in the library. Everyone is welcome to come along. We do not read a set book but instead talk about books we are reading, why we enjoy or do not enjoy them, our favourite genres and writers and a variety of book-related topics. 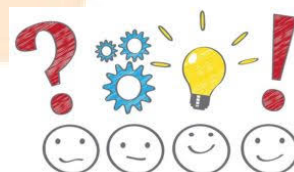


